THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT IN DIFFICULT TIMES

Thanks to your continuing support, JMJ was again able to meet its commitments to help disadvantaged children around the world, to Ancilla School in Wa, Ghana, to Mary Immaculate Kindergarten in Chipata, Zambia, to Present Hope Institute in Ouanaminthe, Haiti and to Asaba Model Nursery and Primary School in Biiso-Kijungu, Uganda.

Not all our projects are successful. For the last 2 years our attempts to send funds to Society Sisters of Maria Auxilium in Chennai, India have resulted in the Indian bank returning the money minus several hundred dollars! For this reason, the India project is on hold until the Sisters can find a secure way to transfer the money.

In the previous year we sent funds to Les Sœurs Missionnaires de l'Immaculée-Conception in Delmas, Haiti. Unfortunately, due to the difficult conditions, the Sisters were unable to provide confirmation of receipt. To maintain our status as a registered charity with the Canadian Revenue Agency, we are required to keep records demonstrating the funds were used for charitable purposes. This project is on hold while we hope and pray for the situation to improve for the sisters in Haiti.

NEW PROJECT: FOI ET JOIE HAITI

JMJ's efforts to support children in Haiti was given a new breath of life when we were invited to attend a Haiti fundraising event on April 7 organised by the Jesuits of Canada. The event was beautifully presented at the historic L'église du Gesù de Montreal and included a mass presided by Provincial Fr. Erik Oland, SJ, who sang at the Mass and with members of the Opera of Montreal during the Haiti-themed meal afterwards. There was also an auction of paintings made by Fr Jean Denis Saint Felix. Fr Jean Franky Guerrier, SJ, the

coordinator of the programs for Haiti, spoke on the different projects, including Foie et Joi Haiti. Their objective is to raise \$2,000,000, of which \$1,000,000 had already been raised at the time of the event.

JMJ approached Fr Franky and explained the difficulty in sending funds to Haiti. We asked if they had a replacement project of similar size. Fr Franky came back with a proposal from Foi et Joie Haiti to support 45 vulnerable children at the Centre Éducatif Congréganiste Nationale du Bas Canaan in Port au Prince and the Centre Éducatif Congréganiste National Saint Ignace of Loyola of Bédoue near Ouanaminthe.

The vulnerable children are selected in consultation with teachers and parents. The expected outcomes are: that at least 45 most vulnerable children in the Canaan and Bedoue educational centers have access to a tuition fee and school materials

subsidy; to promote gender equality by encouraging the retention and schooling of girls, with at least 60% of sponsored children being girls; to reduce the school dropout rate in these educational centers; to ensure food for vulnerable children. The full proposal is available from JMJ.

JMJ has sent \$5000 to support this project for 9 months starting in September. With your help, JMJ can continue supporting this project.

Report from Asaba Model School, Uganda.

On February 23rd, 2024, we received 8,620,184 shillings from J.M.J. Children’s Fund, which is \$2400 USD. I immediately on 25th day of Feb organised a Board meeting and we reached a consensus of buying maize grains stock it in our school store. Then the school and parents will perform the grinding/milling.

We unanimously agreed that providing porridge at lunch time to the whole school was economically viable other than buying posho and beans which would not even complete a term of

Though the stock is getting finished this Friday of 16th Aug 2024.

The staff, children and parents do strongly appreciate for really what J. M. J did for Asaba model school.

We bought 2800kgs of maize @ kg at 3000shs Totalling to 8,400,000shs. (Eight million four

hundred thousand shs only) and 220,000shs (Two hundred twenty thousand shs) was used for Transportation of the maize seeds from where it was bought from up to the school premises.
